PROGRAM Youth and Climate in the Mediterranean+25 Virtual Forum

On the occasion of the 25th anniversary of the Barcelona process, the Government of Catalonia is spearheading **Mediterranean+25**, a series of initiatives, debates and forums to address issues and proposals that seek to disseminate and update the perspectives on Euro– Mediterranean relations. The objective is to bring Mediterranean projection to citizens, to promote exchanges between actors from the north and south and to propose ideas for an updated Mediterranean agenda in Europe.

In conjunction with Euro–Mediterranean stakeholders, networks and organisations, the Government of Catalonia is promoting different activities, including **Dialogues+25**, which will be held from June to October 2020, and **Mediterranean+25 Forums**, which will be held in November and December 2020. Furthermore, in September, a monographic edition of the **magazine** *IDEES* (issue 51) will be published, entitled "A new vision for the Mediterranean".

With regard to the Mediterranean+25 Forums, the Government of Catalonia will actively contribute to the different regional meetings promoted by both different institutions and organisms and the Secretariat of the Union for the Mediterranean. Furthermore, it will spearhead actions that encourage and facilitate programmes, networks and exchanges among civil society actors on the shores of the Mediterranean with the goal of reinforcing the role of multilevel governance in the Mediterranean.

The Mediterranean is one of the most vulnerable regions in the world to the impacts of global warming, as it is warming 20% faster than the global average. Recent accelerated climate change has exacerbated already existing environmental challenges and problems in the Mediterranean Basin that are caused by the combination of changes in land use, increases in pollution and biodiversity losses (MedECC, 2019). In the recent times, young people, worried about their future on a hotter planet and aware that they will have to bear a disproportionate burden of the most devastating effects of climate change, have poured into the streets

in order to demand greater action to address the climate emergency. This youth-led climate movement had demonstrated to demand climate action in so many places and in such numbers around the world on a scale never seen before, shaping the discussion on climate change.

In accordance with the Government of Catalonia's commitment to global challenges, the climate agenda in the Mediterranean and fostering young people as agents of social transformation, a large forum is being planned: the Youth and Climate in the Mediterranean+25 Virtual Forum, which will be held remotely from **9 to 11 December 2020**.

Forum languages will be French and English with simultaneous translation. Catalan and Spanish will be passive languages.

Objectives of each workshop:**

- → To develop part of the contents related to the specific theme: context, concepts, debates, etc.

The sessions will examine how to shift to action from a nonviolent, intersectional perspective of social transformation with a transversal analysis of social movements around the world.

The goal of this workshop is to foster the active role of young activists in social transformation in the Mediterranean region by strengthening their strategies, multiplying their capacity to have an impact and improving their strength as a group to build a fairer and more equitable world to deal with the reality of the climate emergency.

Workshop 2. Cities, young people and sustainability

What should the cities of the future be like? How can we build more sustainable, inclusive urban environments? What role do young people play in this, and what kind of city do they imagine?

This workshop seeks to be a space of reflection on the future of cities in the Mediterranean. MedCities, a network of Mediterranean cities headquartered in Barcelona, proposes an initial session to present projects and good practices on how young people's municipal participation contributes to the struggle against climate change from the urban environment.

The second session proposes a World Café to reflect on and draft specific proposals on sustainable mobility, environmental management, entrepreneurship, the circular economy and other matters that can be debated all together in the third session, to "sketch out" the future green Mediterranean city.

Workshop 3. Digitalisation and innovative solutions for the climate emergency

What role do the new technologies, the media and the social media play in young people actions on climate change and to protect ecosystems? Are they really potential tools for communication, coordination and collective action despite uneven access to them in the region?

The objective of this workshop is to debate the importance of digitalisation and the role of information and communication technologies in the climate emergency and in preserving ecosystems. In this vein, this workshop is also geared at evaluating the needs and opportunities of a fairer, safer, more effective environment on both shores of the Mediterranean.

Several examples will be shared, such as #plogging, #beachcleanup, #cleanupeurope, podcasts, apps for smartphones, etc.

Each workshop will last six hours, divided into three 2-hour sessions which will be held simultaneously on the afternoon of the first day and all of the second day.

Workshop 4. Transformative economies

New proposals for socioeconomic transformation based on longstanding historical traditions like cooperativism and community economies are beginning to gain ground as alternatives to the current established economic order.

They are economies built from the people and by the people, whose common denominators are community management, self-organisation, reconsidering our relationship with natural resources and equality.

This space will be led by different organisations whose perspectives show their individual and collective struggles to turn transformative economies into the economic alternative needed for a more sustainable, fairer and more egalitarian world.

Workshop 5. Influencing decisionmaking

Empowering young people as actors in the social and climate transformation is associated with fostering democratic governance and public participation. What are the mechanisms and instruments available to young people to reach public institutions and regional Euro–Mediterranean actors? What space and what impact do world and regional forums have on climate matters?

The goal of this workshop is to analyse and give voice and space to young people in developing public policies on environmental matters and developing regional projects in the Mediterranean, situating their projects within the debate on the current climate emergency and facilitating the influence of their actions in the political sphere and on the regional Euro–Mediterranean agenda.
